Wise Words: Keep At It...With Steady Resolve

In Jesus' well-known parable of the Sower (Luke 8:1-15), he first warns of threats to the flourishing of God's word, compared to a seed, in our lives—evil forces, lack of roots, cares and excessive pleasures. But he then speaks of good soil in which the planted seed will bear fruit. What is the good soil? It those who "hold fast to the Word with an honest and good heart." But Jesus, importantly, adds something. He says that our flourishing and our effectiveness in displaying our new life in Christ requires patient waiting and steady effort. There are no magic short-cuts. Honesty and purity of heart are a start. But in this new life we bear fruit with patience" (v. 15). So in 2025, keep at it, brothers and sisters, loving others and loving God through obedience and sanctified desire with that steady resolve called patience.
